On behalf of the Board of Directors for Back Bay National Wildlife Refuge Society, I would like to convey our sincere appreciation to all the members, partners and donors who supported us this past year. Our accomplishments are a reflection of your steadfast dedication. This year's achievements are a testament to people like you, who time and time again, step up and help us achieve our goals.

From projects to community events the Society has been able to bring awareness, involvement and support for Back Bay National Wildlife Refuge.

This annual report celebrates what was made possible in 2024 and the following are a few of the highlights accomplished through the dedication and abundance of volunteer hours you provided.

- Outdoor classroom becoming ready for construction.
 Fundraising is ongoing with grants and donations to by end of 2024 resulting in over \$86,000.
- Awarded and implemented a "Wildlife Viewing Through A Community Framework" Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR) grant.
- Maintained the pollinator gardens for local pollinators that "buzz" around the Refuge and monarch butterflies.
- Supported Osprey nest habitats and maintenance on the refuge's 18 Osprey platforms and supported the work for banding of fledgling chicks.

- Continued our educational outreach supporting Virginia Beach City Public Schools title I elementary schools, bringing six hundred 4th graders to the refuge for outdoor hands-on educational experiences
- Hosted spring and fall group refuge bike trail ride
- Participated in Virginia Beach Winter Wildlife Festival and the Refuge's first Back Bay Bash events that helped support and bring awareness to the Society and its endeavors.
- Increased revenue 60% through individual donors, business contributions, donor advised funds, grants & in kind donations.

We have a lot of work ahead this year and are confident it will be accomplished, both within the community and the Refuge, with your support and dedication.


CAPITAL BUILDING CAMPAIGN OUTDOOR CLASSROOM


